1. CSR legislation

- In 2019, the Government requested 75% of the companies' CSR contribution to be transferred to the Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA) redirected to the National Social Inclusion Foundation (NSIF) for redistribution to NGOs but allowed those who were committed in long term projects to contribute only 50 % but required an application for the approval of these projects amounting to 25% of the CSR funds.
- The list of projects submitted by Terra Foundation was approved by the NSIF.



3. Covid-19 emergency funds & other Group supports

Donation of food packs

- Owing to the critical situation following the sudden lockdown in 2020, the group responded by creating a special emergency fund of Rs1,000,000 to support the needlest of the North.
- 339 food packs sponsored for 5 NGOs of the North for a total of Rs 543,762.

Stay safe operation

Donation of masks and sanitizing solution to NGOs of the North and hands free sanitising stations to the SSR National Hospital.

3.1 Social initiatives of Beau Plan Smart City

- 50% of the studies of a Mauritian student at ALU. 2nd year for a degree (3 years sponsorship)
- the clown YUL for visits to the children at SSR Hospital twice a week
- Wall painting in Bois Rouge for awareness on environment with the participation of the youths of the region
- Beau Plan Journal (to enhance region stakeholders and inhabitants) – 12,000 copies in the region

- To promote and support where possible appropriate training to job seekers in the Beau Plan Smart City.

- Maintain Collaboration with other national institutions




